## Elected Board Member - Disability Delegate Role & Responsibilities 30 August 2021

The Disability Delegate plays a vital role in the introduction, development and success of snooker & billiards (the Sport) for people with a disability in Australia. Set out below is an overview of the position.

As an elected member of the Board, the Elected Board Member will be actively involved in the administration of the Sport. This will include:

- 1. Attending the AGM and Board Meetings and being part of the decision-making processes (both formal and electronic) throughout the year.
- 2. Contributing to sub-committees as need be.
- 3. Providing ongoing feedback about all aspects of the Sport from the point of view of people with a disability on the basis that they represent all players at all levels of ability in the Sport.
- 4. Introducing the Sport to people with a disability in Australia and providing a pathway for people with a disability to play the Sport at all levels.
- 5. Fostering the Sport and providing an avenue for people with a disability who play the Sport to bring forward issues and suggestions to the Board.

## The general responsibilities include:

- A. Liaising with players with a disability at all levels of the Sport and representing their interests on the Board.
- B. Contributing positively on social media and acting as a strong advocate and ambassador for the Sport as a whole, whilst reinforcing the ABSC's core values of integrity, communication, trust and accountability.
- C. Identifying potential grant and sponsor opportunities.
- D. Assisting players with a disability grant submissions and funding opportunities.
- E. Identifying opportunities for revenue raising for funds to enhance players with a disability representation at national and international levels.
- F. Working collaboratively in different facets of the administration of the Sport including media, referees, coaching, women and junior development.
- G. Working collaboratively with World Disability Billiards & Snooker (WDBS) to promote and further development the Sport in accordance with the WDBS goals.
- H. Liaising with the other Board Members to coordinate player meetings where appropriate including at all major national events.
